This workshop is open to oil, water-soluble oil, acrylic, and pastel painters. Oil and acrylic painters will see specific recommendations below. Pastel painters should bring their familiar materials. All photos to paint from are provided by Tom.

Required Materials:

- Paints. A minimum palette of Titanium White, Warm White, Cadmium Yellow Light,
 Cadmium Red Pale, Cadmium Red, Ultramarine Blue, Cerulean Blue or Turquoise Blue.
- Colors and brands I use and recommend for oil paint Lucas or Richeson
 Titanium White, Gamblin Warm White, Richeson Cadmium Yellow Light,
 Richeson Cadmium Red Pale, Lucas 1862 Ultra Marine Blue, Richeson
 Turquoise Blue. With these colors you can mix all colors and it makes for a
 better, more harmonious painting.
- Brushes and palette knife. I recommend:
- Richeson brand synthetic blend brights #8 and #12
- Grey Matters 1" synthetic watercolor brush
- Richeson Script liner brush
- Rubber tipped shaper tool
- Small or medium size cheap hardware store brush
- Richeson palette knife, 3 7/8" x 1 3/8"
- Canvas panels in the following sizes. I recommend one 12x16" primed canvas panel for each day with a toned warm tan wash. I will have some for sale during the workshop.
- Richson Grey Matters 12x16" paper palette with disposable gray sheets
- Richeson Jack's Studio Soap
- Vine charcoal
- Walnut oil to thin paint. This can be found at the grocery store. *PenArt is a turpentine free zone.
- Paper towels
- Small container to hold just a little walnut oil at a time

- Ruler or tape measure
- Phone or camera
- Medical gloves
- Tape
- · Plastic bags for trash
- · Pen and pencil
- Lots of questions

For ALL classes, remember to bring:

- Sketchbook and pencil for sketching and notetaking
- Comfortable shoes and/or a rubber mat for cement studio floors
- Apron or smock
- · Sweater; studios are air conditioned
