

This pamphlet includes directions for two kinds of books—accordion and case bound. Accordion books are great for all ages. Teens can use the case bound option to make hardcover sketchbooks.

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Accordion Book



Open up the long, beige piece of paper.







3 Fold those edges back out to line up with the outer folds.

Fold the outside edges in to

the center crease.




Flip the paper over.




Fold it in half




Cut the wallpaper into two equal pieces.


Center and trace a board on the back of one piece of wallpaper.



Cut off the corners.



6 Place the board and press down firmly





3 Draw a diagonal line across each corner, about ½ inch away from the traced corners.



Spread glue inside the tracing.


7 Spread glue along a flap and fold it in.

Repeat step 7 for each flap, pinching down the corner first if there is overlap.





Case Bound Book

Pages


In addition to what is in the kit, you'll need a scissors, pencil, ruler, needle, thread, strip of cloth, two binder clips, extra paper (optional), and an awl or xacto knife.


- Open up the long, beige piece of paper.






Fold the outside edges in to the center crease.







Cut along each crease to make four equal pieces.



Fold each piece in half.



You can add more pages by folding equal stacks of your own paper in half.



Line up all of your papers along their folds and clip them together.

Draw evenly spaced lines across all the folds as indicated.




Make holes for sewing, 8 either by cutting across the folds on the lines or opening the groups of pages and punching holes through the stacks with an awl.

Fold over and glue the ends of the fabric so they are flush with the edges of the pages.



Measure the thickness of the sewn together pages. Cut a strip of cardboard or thick paper that width—this will be the book's spine.




Cut the corners, leaving a distance of about ¹/₈ inch between your cut and the board corners.




Arrange the two boards and spine on the back of the wallpaper as shown. Be sure to leave gaps at least as wide as the thickness of the spine and cover combined.


