## 2D2469: Off the Wall: Encaustic Collage + Assemblage with Sarah Rehmer

Days: Tuesday - Friday Dates: October 22 – 25, 2024 Times: 9am – 4pm

Your tuition includes 1lb of encaustic medium per student, oil sticks, and other shared materials.

## **Required Materials:**

- A roll of paper towels. Should be Viva brand or shop towels from the hardware store. The hot wax soaks through the others too quickly.
- 1 roll of 3M blue painter's tape. Do not buy the Duck brand. It does not have enough tack.
- X-Acto knife with blades
- Scissors
- A roll of baking parchment paper
- Small spray bottle for water
- 3-4 cradled panels to work on. I suggest ordering from cheapjoes.com to get the "Joe's Prime Cradled Painting Panels, standard or extra-deep" in various sizes. Do not get panels any larger than 11x14".
- One 3- or 4-pack of small Ampersand Encausticboards for practice
- Apron or work smock
- Pen and sketchbook/notebook
- Laser printed images for transfers. Make sure they are revered so they will read correctly, extra important if there are words in it. I will have some share as well.

## **Optional Materials:**

- Self-healing cutting mat
- Papers you may want to collage into the work. I will have some shared papers for us to work with also, nothing with acrylic in it.
- Dried-pressed plant materials that can be pressed into the work.
- 3D items for assemblage. I will provide attachment methods and tools consider bringing items that the backside is flat and possibly made from an absorbent material. I will work with you to talk through how to attach various items, but I cannot guarantee you will be able to work with everything you bring.

## For ALL classes, remember to bring:

- Sketchbook and pencil for sketching and notetaking
- Comfortable shoes and/or a rubber mat for cement studio floors
- Apron or smock
- Sweater; studios are air conditioned

The items listed above are recommended by the instructor. You may be asked to bring more than you will actually use. The acquisition and cost of these items are your responsibility.
